DAY 1

Let's go for a wonderful half-day excursion to discover:

THE CHATEAU OF AMBOISE: built on the orders of Charles VIII, Louis XII and Francis I, the Chateau of Amboise was one of the first truly “royal” residences. It is a prestigious example of combined Gothic and Renaissance architecture.

THE CHATEAU OF CHENONCEAU: built in the sixteenth century, one of the purest early French Renaissance style works, constructed on the foundations of an ancient fortified water mill in the river bed itself.

LATE AFTERNOON

Back to Tours. Dinner at the restaurant in the city centre of Tours. Accommodation at the hotel.

DAY 2

Breakfast at the hotel.

IN THE MORNING

THE CHATEAU OF BLOIS. One of the most prestigious testimonies of Renaissance art in France, a perfect illustration of the evolution of French architecture from the Middle Ages to the 17th century.

IN THE AFTERNOON

THE CHATEAU OF CHAMBORD. More than four centuries after its construction, Chambord still defies the imagination: 156 metres of stone façades, 56-metre-high, and 440 rooms.

THE CHATEAU OF CHEVERNY. The model for Marlinspike Hall in Hergé's Adventures of Tintin will surprise you with the richness and diversity of its furniture, and the authentic charm and refined decoration of its rooms.
